

Social tariffs for broadband and phone

Social broadband tariffs help households on low incomes stay connected by offering cheaper and more affordable plans.

Take-up of social broadband tariffs has increased from 1.2% to 3.2% since February 2022, yet there are still nearly 6 million eligible households missing out.

Broadband social tariffs are primarily available to people in receipt of Universal Credit, although some providers accept other means-tested benefits too.

Available from BT, Virgin Media, Sky, Vodafone, Hyperoptic, Community Fibre, and others, social tariffs can help protect against digital exclusion by offering broadband plans from as little as £12 per month.
